VERY YEAR, a few bands at the jubilee really grab the attention of visitors. News of them spreads by word of mouth, building their popularity. Jazz festival organizers — and they are the people who listen to all the bands' tapes or preview their performances — say these are among this year's hot prospects:

Leningrad Dixieland Ensemble

— the first traditional jazz band
from the Soviet Union, they'd be
hot even if they were only mediocre, which festival organizers say

they are not.

Igor's Cowboy Jazz Band — this Tempe, Ariz., outfit was so popular last year, officials had to bring them back again. They play a combination of Dixieland and western swing that delights fans of country music as much as traditional jazz enthusiasts.

Olympia Brass Band — perhaps the most authentic New Orleans band here, with roots back to 1883. "They must be seen and heard by anyone wanting a complete Jubi-

lee," officials say.

Garden Avenue Seven — from Largo, Fla. With Spike Bamsey on piano and the aptly named Paulette Pepper on vocals, this promises to be one hot band. "I think they're going to be very popular," says jazz society vice president Bill Gunter.

Fat Sam's Band — from Edinburg, Scotland, this group is led by Hamish McGregor, formerly of the Scottish Society Syncopators. "I have a hunch, this is going to be this year's hottest act," says jazz

ish really relates to an audience," Gunter adds. "They'll probably play three tunes and the crowd will be in love with them."
